ABOUT YOUR JUDGE

Mrs Lynda Fauvrelle (Fionnlugh)

I acquired my first Irish Setter, Willkier Solomans Seal, in 1980 when Bruneau and I lived in Essex. I have been hooked on these wonderful mischievous characters ever since, having added to the brood with 'Sparkle' by Sh Ch Brendower Bronze Champayne, 'Christy' – Barleydale Golden Rambler bred by the late Shelagh Vant, Goldings Mavourneen bred by Bidy and Gordon Evans and various Shaytells bred by Jackie and Roy Rout. Having continued showing with a deal of success, the highlight was the making up to Show Champion of our Shaytell Andante under Pat Brigden in 2007.

I also have an interest in the working side of the breed and, with Bruneau, have attended several field trials as spectators and most recently a field trial training day run by the Gordon Setter Association with our Hunnicote Bracken Sweetie who, despite having the devil in her a lot of the time, did herself proud. From the early '80s through to 1998 I served on two regional committees of the ISBC: the Eastern Region Social Group, then the South East Region Social Group, the latter as Secretary for a number of years. I joined the committee of the South of England Irish Setter Club in 1999 holding the role of Show Secretary for the past eight years. I feel it is important to contribute in whatever way I can to the breed that has given me so much loyalty, love and pleasure. I first judged the breed in 1994; have attended judging seminars gaining the requisite certificates and have also judged various other Gundog breeds.

As well as enjoying walking – with or without the dogs – I like to read, sew and potter in the garden although 'The Reds' do seem to do a lot of the digging and pruning.....

RULES & REGULATIONS

No other breed of dog will be allowed within the precincts of the show except those permitted by Regulation F(1) 3.55/11

1. The Show will open at 9.30am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.30am.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. Entry Fees: Members £5.00 first entry per dog; Non Members £6.50 first entry per dog; £1.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog. Catalogues: £2.00 pre-paid with entries (limited number available on the day at £2.50). Membership: UK – Single £9.00; Joint £10.00; Overseas – Single £11.00; Joint £12.00.
7. Prize Money: Best in Show £25; Reserve Best in Show £15; Best Puppy in Show £10; Best Veteran in Show £10.
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
11. **Best Puppy in Show**
 - a. Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
 - b. *Withdrawal from Other Competition* Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
 - c. *Proviso* For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
12. **Best in Show**
 - a. The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.
 - b. *Withdrawal from other competition* Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
 - c. *Proviso* For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
14. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
15. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
16. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

17. **Dogs in Cars on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
- Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. All dogs must be brought with a suitable chain and a collar properly fastened to the dog.
20. All exhibits must be accompanied. The Committee cannot undertake to accept or despatch unaccompanied dogs.
21. Should any of the judges be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserve the right to appoint a substitute. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entrance fee can be refunded.
22. Each Judge will be instructed and empowered to withhold any prize in any class, if of the opinion that the dog does not possess sufficient merit. Judges are not empowered to give prizes beyond those offered in the Schedule. A Judge's decision shall be final except in a case of fraud, or misrepresentation or where a mistake has been made bona fide by the Judge.
23. An announcement prior to closing of entries in 'Our Dogs' or 'Dog World' of any alterations or additions made by the Committee to the Schedule or to these Regulations, shall be deemed sufficient notice thereof.
24. Parents will be held responsible for the actions and any damage caused by their children within the environs of the show.
25. The Owner, Exhibitor, Handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club Licensed events, must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.
26. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Anyone failing to clear up will be reported to the Committee who may enforce the right to refuse entries from that exhibitor for future shows.
27. The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs entered for exhibition and for any property entrusted to them, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and other persons that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss, or detention of or damage to any dog or person from any cause whatsoever, nor for any act or omission of themselves, their officers, Servants, agents or others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
28. The Officers & Committee of the Irish Setter Association, England cannot accept responsibility for any products advertised or sold by stall holders and/or trade stands at this Show. Exhibitors are reminded that products on sale for the preparation and grooming of dogs may not meet the requirements of the Regulation for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F(B).
29. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
30. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.
31. The Association reserves to itself the right to refuse entries and all dishonoured cheques will be charged at £10 for subsequent presentations.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(The word "dog" includes both sexes)

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Saturday, 24th April 2010**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

(2) *Transfer*

a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

MAIDEN For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at an Open or Championship show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE

From M40 North

Leave at Junction 8a, turn right at first roundabout and at 2nd roundabout follow the road and signs for A40 Oxford, cross the bridge that runs over the A40, take first hand turning just over the bridge signposted Wheatley. Follow road for a couple of miles past Harvester on left, Wyevale Garden Centre on your right. Straight over 1st mini roundabout, at 2nd mini roundabout turn left, at bottom of road go straight over the staggered crossroads, down to a second crossroads, straight over again and follow the road out of Wheatley (Ladder Lane) into open countryside, past Millview Plant Centre on your right, take the next right signposted Horspath. Down very steep hill into Horspath, under Bridge, Chequers Pub and Village Stores on your right, very sharp left hand bend, just past Garage on your left, Horspath Village Hall opposite, just before chicane.

From M40

Leave M40 at Junction 8 take first turn off signposted A418 to Aylesbury. At top of slip road turn left, signposted Wheatley. Directions as above paragraph from this point.

From A34 Newbury

From Newbury take A34 to Oxford, take first exit off to Oxford, turn right at roundabout straight over the next three roundabouts, follow signs for A40 London, High Wycombe. Over flyover signposted Watlington, get in to right hand lane and turn right at large traffic light junction signposted Horspath. Follow road in to Horspath, through the chicane, Horspath Village Hall is on your left, just before Garage on the right.

From West A40 Cheltenham

Join Oxford Ring Road, follow signs Ring Road A40 London & M40, until the large Headington roundabout, straight over signposted to Cowley, Oxford Business & Science Park. Through two sets of traffic lights, just before third set of traffic lights, turn left signposted Horspath Industrial Estate & Horspath. Follow road in to Horspath, through the chicane Horspath Village Hall is on your left, just before the Garage on your right.
