## Kennel Club Breeders' Competition 2010

The Breeders' Competition offers the following Awards:

**Best Breeder in Breed**

**Best Breeder in AVNSC Classes**

**Best Breeder in Group 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th**

**Grand Final at DFS Crufts 2011**

The following requirements apply to entries for these awards:

1. Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders Competition Record Book from the Kennel Club or from the show secretary.
2. The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group, or team
3. The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
4. The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to compete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.
5. The Breeder's team must comprise four exhibits of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.
6. A Breeder may enter more than one team per show.
7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
8. The 'beaten dog' rule will NOT apply.
9. Best Breeder in Breed and Best Breeder in AVNSC Classes goes through to a Best Breeder in Group award.
10. Breeders acquire points in competition over a calendar year as follows:

Breed win	1 point
Win in AVNSC Classes	1 point
Fourth in Group	1 point
Third in Group	2 points
Second in Group	3 points
First in Group	4 points

The thirty Breeders who have amassed the highest number of points over a calendar year will qualify for the DFS Crufts Final in the following year. At the end of the competition year in question, Breeders should forward their record books to the Canine Activities Department at the Kennel Club which will advise whether they have qualified for the DFS Crufts Final.

# ROYAL CANIN

## TODAY'S JUDGES

### ***Dogs: Mr Larry Lunn (Millgarth)***

I was first introduced to the breed in the late 1940s by a cousin, Harry Foulkes (Salken), later owner of Ch Buninyong Caesar and who incidentally judged this show in 1967. It goes without saying that I was immediately smitten and remained so to this day but it was not until 1953 that I obtained my first puppy (against advice) showing her with little success. In 1959 I purchased Weycombe Benny and with my father, Bill, coming into partnership with me, we campaigned him to his title amassing 14 RCCs along the way. Our prefix/affix Millgarth was registered in 1961 and in February of that year I experienced my biggest thrill in Staffords by taking the Dog CC at Crufts under Jimmy Russ (Relyon), losing out rightly on BOB to that great bitch Ch Judy of Brunaburgh. During the 60s we bred a couple of litters and exported to the United States a dog that became Am/Can Ch Millgarth Powerpack CDEx, which, I understand, had quite an influence. Also, around this time we bred a good bitch, We Wonder of Millgarth, who had some success in the 'ring' but, she died young, unfortunately without issue. From 1970 until around 77/78 although still keeping a dog, I had to curtail my involvement somewhat due to family commitments but later in the 80s I bought a 'Fulfin' bitch from Malcolm Boam. This bitch put to Surestaff Dark Daemon produced a very good dog – Millgarth Jack Cracker, which did a lot of winning early on but too much exercise stopped him reaching his full potential. In the nineties I obtained a daughter of 'Rip Van Winkle' (Josie's Jewel) from Roger Pugh which my daughter, Nancy, showed with some success and later from another bitch of this line I bred a lovely bitch, Millgarth Centre Stage, who absolutely hated showing and other dogs. I have not bred lots of litters and have never been in the position to have lots of dogs and those that I have had, for the most part, die of old age. When I have bred I have strived for 'type', health & temperament. I can assure you I do not have any colour preferences or bias where dogs are concerned and further, as those who know me will tell you, I only judge what's on the bottom end of the lead for I'm only interested in promoting good sound stock. Whilst my father judged one of the Society's Open Shows in the 1960s it was not until 1990 that I was persuaded (by our Chairman and others) to judge, having declined many invites over the years. Finding that I enjoyed it, I then decided to go as far as possible. Here I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all concerned for affording me the honour of judging this prestigious show and taking into account my family's involvement in the Society, as well as my own, I will fulfil a lifelong held ambition. Finally to exhibitors and officials alike I hope you all have a good day and enjoy the show as much as I intend to do.

### ***Bitches: Mr Ken Meneer (Reneem)***

Although I have been showing and judging dogs since the 1970s, my association with Staffords did not come about until 1988 when as a family we were inherited by a bitch called Meandering Misty of Quinnell, and hence as a family we were smitten with the breed. Misty was mated only once and produced Quinnell First Blood who was shown and went on to gain his Junior Warrant and Stud Book number. Although none of the dogs that I have shown or bred have gone on to gain CCs in the UK I have been very fortunate to have been associated with, in my opinion, some good dogs, namely Reneem Molly Malone, Reneem Man For All Seasons and Reneem Off The Cuff, all of which went on to gain Stud Book numbers. I have also bred 5 other Crufts qualifiers, the only dog I have exported, Reneem Quick Draw Magraw, went on to become a Canadian Grand Champion at 9 months. My judging appointments at Limit and Open Show level has seen me judging in most parts of the UK and in 2008 I was privileged to award CCs for the first time at the SKC Show where my principal winners were Ch Bellerphon Bevin Boy (Dog CC), Waystaff Strikes Back (Reserve Dog CC), Suburon Sharron (Bitch CC), Dinalghi Touch of Class (Reserve Bitch CC) and Bourtie Wot A Boy (Best Puppy). Having been a member of the Society for 22 years and serving committee member for 17 of those years I am really looking to the appointment and being on the other side of the fence so to speak. I would like to thank the members of the Society for affording the privilege and honour of judging their Championship Show.

• **NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS** •

Please check all details relating to age and eligibility when completing your entry form.

As per rule 20 of this schedule, late entries will not be accepted. So please post your entry early and ask for proof of posting at the post office.

## • DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES •

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Monday, 20th September 2010.**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 21.

(2) *Transfer*

a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

**MINOR PUPPY** For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**PUPPY** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**JUNIOR** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**YEARLING** For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**MAIDEN** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at an Open or Championship show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

**NOVICE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

**GRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 4 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**POST GRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**LIMIT** For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**OPEN** For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

**VETERAN** For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

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**NOT FOR COMPETITION** Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

## • RULES and REGULATIONS •

1. The Show will open at 9.30 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at: 10.30 am PROMPT in both rings.
4. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed by which time dogs must be removed. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. Exhibits may not be removed any earlier unless by written order of the Veterinary Surgeon, Veterinary Practitioner or of the Show Management and then only in very exceptional and unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to the Kennel Club.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. Entry Fees: **Members** £10.00 First entry per dog; **Non-Members** £11.00 First entry per dog; £2.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog. Not for Competition: £2.00 per dog. Catalogues: £2.50 pre-paid with entries (£3.00 on the day). Catalogue Advertisements: £7.50 Full Page; £4.00 Half Page (additional £4.00 per photograph). Membership: £6.00 (confined to a maximum of two persons).
7. There is no Prize Money on offer at this Show, unless Specials are donated.
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
11. **Best Puppy in Show** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.  
*Withdrawal from Other Competition:* Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.  
*Proviso:* For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
12. **Best in Show** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which had competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.  
*Withdrawal from Other Competition:* Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.  
*Proviso:* For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
14. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
15. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
16. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
17. **Dogs in Cars on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club

offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
20. All dogs at the time of entry for a show shall be solely and unconditionally the property of the exhibitor and must at the time of exhibition be registered in the name of the exhibitor at the Kennel Club.
21. All entries must be made on or before **Monday, 27th September 2010** (Postmark) upon forms enclosed for that purpose together with the required amount of entry fees and **on-line entries by midnight on Thursday, 7th October 2010 at [www.fossedata.co.uk](http://www.fossedata.co.uk)**. No acknowledgment will be sent unless a stamped addressed postcard is sent with the entries. **LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. THE ONLY ACCEPTABLE PROOF OF ENTRY IS AN OFFICIAL RECEIPT ISSUED BY THE POST OFFICE AT THE TIME OF POSTING.**
22. The Committee are empowered to exclude any vicious dog or any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition either from disease, vice, natural or other causes and if any such exclusion takes place either before or after the dog is judged the entry fee shall be forfeited.
23. A Judge shall be empowered to withhold any award, if, in their opinion there is lack of sufficient merit.
24. The decision of the judge shall be final except in the case of fraud or where a mistake has been made 'bona fide' by the judge. No alteration of the awards may be made after the Show without special permission of the Kennel Club.
25. No animal other than a dog duly entered at the show will be admitted within the precincts of the show.
26. Should either or both of the judges be prevented from fulfilling their engagement the Executive Committee reserve to themselves the right of appointing other judges to fulfil their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be returned (Vide K.C. Show Regulations).
27. The acceptance of a dog for exhibition shall not be taken to imply that the Committee warrants or guarantees that the dog is in a fit state for exhibition or complies with the regulations for the preparation of dogs for exhibition and the Committee shall not be liable in any way whatsoever if the dog is subsequently found to have been unfit for exhibition or not to have complied with the said regulations.
28. The Committee shall not be held responsible for exhibitors missing their classes.
29. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.
30. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
31. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

## **REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (Annex B)**

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A 42.
  - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
  - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A 42.
2.
  - a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
  - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
  - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
  - (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
  - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

## DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE

**Road directions from M25: Junction 11 (Chertsey):** Take A320 into Woking, along Victoria Way past Peacocks Shopping Centre, under Victoria railway arch, follow A320 towards Guildford. Turn left at bottom of hill, Claremont Avenue (signposted A247 and to Leisure Centre) and left again into Kingfield Road. Leisure Centre and Pool car park entrance is on the left opposite Woking Football Club. For easier parking do not use main car park use the designated car park by taking the first left (Elmbridge Road) after the centre car park and then 1st left again. Sign boards will be posted.

**Road directions from M25/A3 Junction 10:** Head southbound towards Guildford. Take slip road exit for Ripley and follow Portsmouth Road B2215 through Ripley until Burntcommon Roundabout. Turn right onto A247 towards Send. Follow road to Old Woking. Turn left at mini roundabout, right at second mini roundabout into Kingfield Road. Leisure Centre and Pool car park entrance 1/2 mile on the right. For easier parking do not use main car park use the designated car park by turning right (Elmbridge Road) before the entrance to the main car park and then first left. Sign boards will be posted.
