RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1 The Show will open at 9.00am
- 2 Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3 Judging will commence at 10.00am (Dogs 10.00am – Bitches 10.30am).
- 4 This is an unbenched show. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5 The use of cooking stoves in the hall or proximity of the hall is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- 6 The entry fees will be £16.00 per hound first entry (Members), £20.00 per hound first class (Non-Members), £2.00 subsequent entries with same hound. Not for Competition £2.00 per hound. Veterans £4.00 first entry each hound. Exhibitors will be liable for any extra bank charges should their cheques not be cleared by our bankers. You may also enter on line at www.fossedata.co.uk.
- 7 The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8 Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition. Puppies of 4-6 months may be entered not for competition.
- 9 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 10 **Best Puppy in Show.** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled, the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy. Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Proviso. For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.

- 11 **Best in Show.** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which had competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Proviso. For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

- 12 Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13 No modification will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 14 All Exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annexe B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15 All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

16 DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK, FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club regulations to refuse any entry.

- 17 Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be KC registered.
- 18 The Show will be held under Kennel Club Regulations. Every exhibitor making an entry for this Show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by Kennel Club Rules and Show Regulations and it is on this understanding only, that entries are received. The Kennel Club shall be the final court of appeal in the case of a dispute. All dogs must be registered or transferred at the Kennel Club before the Show.

RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

- 19 All postal entries must be made on or before Monday 13th September 2010 (1st class postmark). If acknowledgement of entries is required, a stamped addressed postcard must be enclosed. Online entries can be made up to noon on Sunday 19th September 2010 on www.fossedata.co.uk.
- 20 All dogs must have a collar and lead.
- 21 The Committee is empowered to exclude or remove any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition from disease, vice, natural or other causes and if such exclusion takes place either before or after the dog is judged the entry fee will be forfeited.
- 22 Exhibitors may state on their entry form the price at which they are prepared to sell their dogs. All negotiations for the sale must be conducted between buyers and sellers.
- 23 The Catalogue will contain owners' names and addresses with their dogs in numerical order. Addresses may be withheld if the relevant box has been ticked.
- 24 All exhibits must be accompanied. The Committee cannot undertake to accept or despatch unaccompanied dogs.
- 25 Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling their engagement the Committee reserves the right to appoint a substitute. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be returned.
- 26 The judges will be instructed and empowered to withhold the prize or prizes in any class if in their opinion the dog or dogs exhibited do not possess sufficient merit. Judges are not empowered to give prizes beyond those offered in the Schedule.
- 27 All entries and correspondence should be addressed to the Acting Show Manager
- 28 No exhibitors' passes will be sent out.

Kennel Club Breeders' Competition 2010 BEST BREEDER IN BREED Grand Final at Crufts 2011

The following requirements apply to entries for these awards:

1. Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders Competition Record Book from the Kennel Club.
2. The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group, or team
3. The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
4. The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to compete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.
5. The Breeder's team must comprise four exhibits of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.
6. A Breeder may enter more than one team per show.
7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
8. The 'beaten dog' rule will NOT apply.
9. Twenty points are required to qualify for Finals at Crufts in the following year. Points are cumulative over a calendar year and are gained as follows:
Breed win 1 point. At Group Championship Shows; Fourth in Group 1 point, Third in Group 2 points, Second in Group 3 points, First in Group 4 points
Breeders gaining 20 points should apply to the Canine Activities Department at the Kennel Club to apply for the Crufts Final. After amassing 20 points a breeder cannot enter any further Best Breeder Competitions for that calendar year.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club.

Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club, which count towards the title of Champion, shall be five point Green Stars or more.

Wins at Championship Shows in Breed Classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' Classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a Member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. 6th September 2010.

Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes but when entering in Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety Classes must be counted. First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) **Withdrawal**

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9 (j) and 20.

(2) **Transfer**

- (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- (b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class or Puppy Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class or the Junior Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy or Junior Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- (c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES CONTINUED

MINOR PUPPY	For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
PUPPY	For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
JUNIOR	For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
YEARLING	For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
NOVICE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at an Open or Championship Show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
GRADUATE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes, whether restricted or not.
POST GRADUATE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes, whether restricted or not.
MID LIMIT	For dogs which have not won three Challenge Certificates or five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
LIMIT	For dogs which have not won three Challenge Certificates under three different judges or seven or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
OPEN	For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
VETERAN	For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.
SPECIAL VETERAN	For Dogs of over ten years of age on the first day of the Show.
SPECIAL BEGINNERS	For dogs owned and handled by exhibitors whose dogs have never won a Challenge Certificate.
SPECIAL OPEN	Similar to Open Classes except that it is restricted as shown in the classification.
BREEDERS STAKES	For dogs bred by the exhibitor.
NOT FOR COMPETITION	Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.

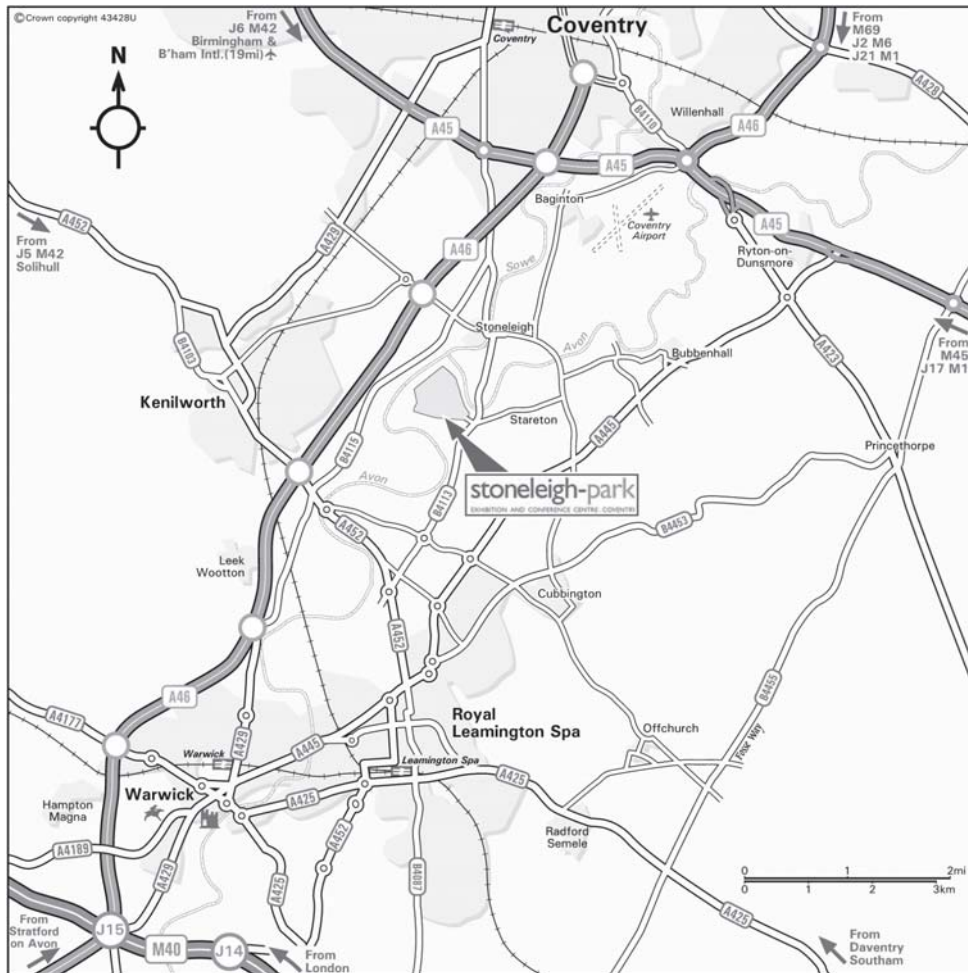

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION – F(B)

- 1 These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee and may include reference for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A 42
- 2
 - (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- 3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of the dewclaws of any breed.
 - (c) The shortening of tails of customarily docked breeds but only up to an acceptable age limit which shall be prescribed from time to time
 - (d) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are show.
- 4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be their responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- 6 Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

Directions to Stoneleigh Park



Situated conveniently between major motorways The Kennel Club Building at Stoneleigh Park is located just off the A46 dual carriageway which links the M40 (junction 15) with the M69 and the M6 (junction 2).

The entrance to Stoneleigh Park is on the B4113, Stoneleigh Road between Coventry and Leamington Spa which is accessed from the A46 following the signs to 'Stoneleigh Park', 'National Agricultural Centre' or 'NAC', or from the A45 following the signs to Stoneleigh.

As you drive into Stoneleigh Park, the exhibitors KC car park is at the bottom of 1st Avenue, reached by taking the second left turning just before the security control point to the main entrance. The Kennel Club Building is at the head of 1st Avenue off the main road a short distance inside the main gate reached by a pedestrian walkway and road from the car parking area. Please note that Stoneleigh Park has a 20mph speed limit

Stoneleigh Park's Dog Exercise Policy

THE KENNEL CLUB BUILDING is on Stoneleigh Park Showground, which is owned by the Royal Agricultural Society England (RASE). As such, all visitors to the Kennel Club Building must abide by RASE's policies on exercising dogs. This policy states that dogs must be on a lead at all times, except if in the designated Stoneleigh Park Dog Exercise Ring or the Kennel Club Building's gated outside rings.

All exhibitors and visitors to the Show are advised that they must stay in the areas surrounding the Kennel Club Building, unless using the Stoneleigh Park Dog Exercise Ring, as the rest of the Showground is private property.
